Welcome to the Community Arts & Crafts Competitive Exhibits Department! All entries will be displayed in the Alan Jay Arena. The Arena will close at 10pm nightly and remain secured during off hours.

Registration and Exhibit Entry is free and open to all residents of Highlands County.

Please go to www.hcfair.net to register in the Community Arts & Crafts. This Department is for all Arts & Crafts and other Contests offered at the Highlands County Fair. Paper entry forms are available online and in the Fair Office.

Pre-registration is required and closes on Friday, January 26th, 2024.

Exhibit Drop Off:

Exhibit Release Date:

Sunday, February 11th, 2024 in the Alan Jay Arena from 11am-2pm.

Claim tickets must be presented in order to claim items. The Fair Association is not responsible for and will dispose of any remaining articles not picked up by 2pm on Sunday February 11th, 2024 unless prior arrangements have been made. Please remember, ***items and ribbons will not be available until after 11am on Sunday February 11th. Premium monies will be mailed to the exhibitor after the close out of Fair.***

General Rules:

1. Pre-registration via online registration or paper entry is **mandatory**. Online registration is available at www.hcfair.net and will close at **Midnight on Friday, January 20th, 2024**, paper entry forms can be printed on www.hcfair.net or can be picked up at the Fair Office. Paper entries are due **by 5pm on Friday, January 26th, 2024**, paper entries can be mailed to 781 Magnolia Ave, Sebring FL 33870 or dropped by the Fair Office during regular business hours.
2. The Community Arts & Crafts is for competitive exhibits that are open to the public, exhibitions, education, and demonstration purposes. Sale(s) of exhibited items is prohibited during the Fair.
3. The Highlands County Fair Community Arts & Crafts is open to all amateur and professional artists, hobbyists and crafters who reside within Highlands County (including winter residents with a local address). There are **NO ENTRY FEES**. All items will be judged on individual merit (with the exception of Best of Show winners). Explanation of ribbons and prizes can be found within the Explanation of Prizes section.
4. All items entered must be completed, clean, odor free, in good taste, and the handiwork of the exhibitor listed on the Entry Form. Any items that do not meet the requirements will not be accepted. If an item is accepted as an oversight, it may later be disqualified and/or not judged or displayed.
5. Each entry will be judged on its own merit. Judging is done by the most qualified judges available; all judges decisions are final. The name of the exhibitor is concealed during judging to ensure that each entry will be judged fairly on its own merit. The entry of only one item in a division does not necessarily guarantee the top award for that entry. Items will **not** be accepted for judging that have been previously exhibited in the Highlands County Fair.
6. Entries must have been completed within the 2023-2024 Calendar Year to be eligible for judging.
7. All exhibits are under the management of the Fair Association. The Fair Association will take every precaution to protect exhibits, however the

Association, it's Officers or Agents will not be responsible for accident, loss, or damage of any entry. The Fair Association reserves the right to display or not display any item.

1. Exhibitor may enter a maximum of 5 exhibits in any one Division and a total of 15 exhibits in all Divisions.

2. Judging: All items within a class will be judged on a points based system according to their own merit. Placings will be awarded based on the highest points in each class. All first-place class winners in the respective Division will be judged for Best of Show.
3. All Premium Monies will be mailed by check to the Exhibitor within two weeks of the Fairs closing date.
4. All Amateur and Professional Entries will qualify for Premium payouts.
5. All Best of Show Winners will be listed on Social Media to compete in a People's Choice Voting category. People's Choice Voting will take place beginning Saturday, February 4th and will end on Friday February 10th at Midnight. Announcement of People's Choice Winner will take place on Saturday, February 11th on the Highlands County Fair Facebook page.

Division II: Handcrafts & General Crafts

Class:	Description:	Specifics to Class:
1	Ceramics & Pottery	Interiors must be glazed, and bottoms of pieces must not be covered by felt or any other material.

3	Leather	All leather items will be judged on overall leather craftsmanship, originality & general appearance of the construction and pattern.
4	Origami/Paper Folding	No glue, staples, tape, or any other adhesive may be used to hold pieces together. Entries may not be cut or torn.

7	Stained Glass	
8	Clay Figurines	Open to modeling clay or Play-Doh. All pieces must be fired or baked to be eligible for judging.

Division III: Nature Arts

Nature Arts Rules:

1. All General Rules apply.
2. One entry per person, per class.

Class:	Description:	Specifics to Class:
1	Fairy Garden	Entry must be assembled offsite on a board or surface that can be moved if necessary. Max 20lbs.
2	Rock Painting	If multiple rocks are used in the piece they must be contained together in the display.
3	Terrarium	Entry must be an original creation, be ready for display and be able to sit on a display table or to be hung. Max 20lbs.

4	Succulent Display	Entry must be an original creation and be able to sit on a display table or be hung. Max 20lbs.
5	DIY Chia Animals	DIY kit provided by the Highlands County Fair! Shape your creature, pack it with the growing medium and water as needed! Once sprouted trim grass to your preference or decorate!
6	Pinecone Art	Entry must be an original creation consisting of at least one variety of pinecone. Art piece can use a whole pinecone or pieces but must be ready for display.
7	Shell Art	Entry must be an original creation consisting of at least one variety of shell found within Florida. Art piece must be ready for display.

Division IV: Fine Art

Fine Art Rules:

1. All General Rules apply.
2. Limit 3 pieces per class per exhibitor.
3. All entries must be framed, except gallery wrap paintings- which must have **FINISHED SIDES**. Definition of a gallery wrapped piece of art is that the painting must extend all the way to the back of the canvas.
4. All entries except gallery wrap paintings must be ready to hang.
5. Only wire hangers all the way across the back of the frame or saw tooth hangers will be accepted.

Division V: Photography

Photography Rules:

1. All General Rules apply.
2. Limit three entries per class per exhibitor.
3. Pictures must be a minimum of 8"x10". If photography entry is matted the full photo must show.
4. All entries must be ready to hang- only wire hangers all the way across the back of the frame or saw tooth hangers will be accepted.
5. If photo has been digitally enhanced in any way (black and white or color entries) they may only be submitted in the Digitally Enhanced class.

Division VI: LEGO & K'NEX

LEGO & K'NEX Rules:

1. All General Rules apply.
2. Amateur exhibitors ONLY.
3. Limit one entry per exhibitor.
4. Entries can be LEGO, K'NEX or a combination of both.
5. All entries must be assembled offsite on a board or surface that can be moved, if necessary, without the entry becoming unstable.
6. No kits may be used to construct entries, individual pieces from a kit may be used but no entry may be completely constructed from a kit design.
7. Maximum entry size may be 2'x3' and no heavier than 20lbs.

Division VIII: Penmanship

Penmanship Rules:

1. All General Rules apply.
2. Limit one entry per exhibitor. **Paper MUST be displayed in a clear plastic sleeve for judging- Name and Entry Division must appear on BACK, TOP RIGHT-HAND CORNER OF ENTRY.**

3. Amateurs Exhibitors ONLY.
4. Each entry may be no more than one page.
5. Locate the writing that pertains to your age group, **write exactly as it appears- including all punctuation!**
6. Printing or cursive is acceptable, but it must be the **same** throughout the writing.
7. Paper for all age groups should measure 8 ½ x 11” and have no decorations.
8. Lined white penmanship paper is suggested but unlined paper is permitted. Paper that is **not** acceptable includes paper with a dashed middle line (*except for Little Sprouts and Jr Youth Divisions*), paper from a spiral notebook and colored paper.
9. Use black or blue ink, not a felt tip pen. **For Small Sprouts and Jr Youth, a pencil is acceptable.**

Judging Criteria Includes:

1. Correct formation of letters
2. Even spacing between letters, words and lines
3. Appropriate margins (at least ½” on all sides of the papers)
4. Adherence to one method of writing (all printing or all cursive)
5. Exactness to excerpt presented (punctuation, no omitted words, no misspelled words, etc.)
6. Overall neatness

Division IX: Trending Arts

Trending Arts Rules:

1. All General Rules apply.
2. Maximum one entry per class per exhibitor.
3. Trending categories may change annually depending on popular art culture at the time.
4. Each class will be judged against only their own entries and the top winner in each class will receive a special rosette.
5. Premiums will be paid for blue, red and white ribbons. No premium for the top winner in each class.

1	Button Art	Button art can be a wide range of things- please have entry ready to be displayed either on a table or by hanging.
2	Upcycled Painting	Add your personal flair to any previously painted art piece. Use your imagination to add new elements to an art piece done by a different artist. Thrift stores, garage sales and even your own home may have a perfect piece just waiting for a facelift. All art pieces must be submitted ready to be hung for display.
3	Chop Stick Art	All projects must feature at least 5 chopsticks or pieces of chopsticks. Chopsticks may be decorated or left natural.
4	Bubble Wrap Sculpture	The sky is the limit for this challenge! The only materials permitted for the structure are bubble wrap (any size), plastic wrap (clear or colored) and clear packing tape. Additional embellishments (eyes, whiskers, markers, etc) are allowed. Sculpture must be ready for display and no larger than 3'x3'.
5	Pool Noodle Animal	A pool noodle must be used as the main base for this project, but other materials may be added to create the look you desire.
6	Dollar Store Special	Attention Pinterest artists, this one is for you! Create any project using Dollar Store items that cost no more than \$10 (glue and other adhesives do not need to be included in the cost).

Trending Art Helpful Tips:

1. Get creative! These categories are all about using your imagination!
2. Use Pinterest and other Internet search sites to help find unique ideas.
3. There are many useful videos on YouTube that will provide insight and helpful tips for your project.
